Nigel Barnes has been employed by Motorola for over fifteen years. He has had long experience of standardisation, having started with CT2, followed by DECT, where he was an active delegate in the DECT Generic Access Platform (GAP) meetings, and also regularly attended ETSI RES03 and ETSI RES meetings.

Nigel started GSM and 3GPP standardisation work more than 10 years ago, regularly attending SMG1, SMG4, SMG9 and SMG10 meetings, and later on he represented Motorola at SMG plenary. Nigel chaired the joint SMG9/SMG10 working group that developed the Secure Messaging series of Specifications for communication to and from the SIM Application Toolkit. Nigel was elected as Vice Chair of SMG9 in 1997.
