Antiquity:

- Exists before the Mycenaean civilization (since 9600 BC?)
- First king is Cecrops, founded Cecropia (Acropolis, <u>Acharnae</u>, Eleufsis)
- First regislator is Drakon (621 BC)
- Cleisthenes establishes democracy for the first time (508 BC)
- Pericles Golden Age of Athenian democracy: <u>Aeschylus</u>, <u>Sophocles</u> and <u>Euripides</u> flourished in Athens during this time, as did the historians <u>Herodotus</u> and <u>Thucydides</u>, the physician <u>Hippocrates</u>, and the philosopher <u>Socrates</u>. Guided by <u>Pericles</u>, who promoted the arts and fostered democracy, Athens embarked on an ambitious building program that saw the construction of the Acropolis of Athens (including the <u>Parthenon</u>)
- Platonic Academy Aristotle is considered the father of all Western science. He was the first to classify the fields of human knowledge into their own disciplines, such as mathematics and biology. Many of these classifications are still in use today. Aristotle studied, among others, anatomy, astronomy, embryology, geography, geology, meteorology, physics, and zoology. In philosophy, he wrote, among others on ethics, metaphysics, politics, psychology, rhetoric and theology.

Roman era:

In 146 BC, Athens was conquered by the Romans, who respected the city and did not harm it. Many Romans (Hadrian, Cicero, Antoninus,
Augustus, Philopappus, etc.) visited the city, studied there, benefited it with great works. Athens regained its former glory and became the
cultural center of the empire, famous for its schools.

Syzantine era:

In the early 4th century AD, the <u>Eastern Roman Empire</u> began to be governed from <u>Constantinople</u>, and with the construction and expansion of the imperial city, many of Athens's works of art were taken by the emperors to adorn it. The Empire became Christianized, and the use of Latin declined in favour of exclusive use of Greek. In the <u>Roman imperial period</u>, both languages had been used.

Modern history:

- The first King of Greece, King Otto of Bavaria, commissioned the architects Stamatios Kleanthis and Eduard Schaubert to design a modern city plan fit for the capital of a state. The first modern city plan consisted of a triangle defined by the Acropolis, the ancient cemetery of Kerameikos and the new palace of the Bavarian king (now housing the Greek Parliament), so as to highlight the continuity between modern and ancient Athens. Neoclassicism, the international style of this epoch, was the architectural style through which Bavarian, French and Greek architects such as Hansen, Klenze, Boulanger or Kaftantzoglou designed the first important public buildings of the new capital.
- In 1896, Athens hosted the first modern <u>Olympic Games</u>.




Medical assistance on-site during 3GPP meetings in Athens


