This liaison is in response to the liaison sent by 3GPP SA3 to OMA Security on the evolution of WAP-219-TLS.

### 2 Proposal

OMA Security appreciates your liaison letter with respect to Presence.

We are not working on updating WAP-219 at this time. According to the OMA rules, there will not be any changes made to WAP interoperability specifications. OMA Security would have to issue an OMA enabler with your suggested changes in a new format. This is not anticipated in your REL-6 time frame. Note however that WAP-219 allows for other cipher suites, e.g., AES (see section 6.1).
