1. Overall Description:

3GPP-T3 acknowledges the OMA DM liaison statement "OMA DM WG request for information".

3GPP-T3 supports the idea to avoid any work duplication while defining service parameters. The understanding currently is that:

- all bearer independent service parameters are defined in the area of OMA Device Management
- all 3GPP specific service parameters are defined in the area of 3GPP.

Furthermore, 3GPP-T3 implements the requirements at 3GPP-SA1's request.

For example, in the MMS case, although it is felt that MMS specification will be transferred to OMA, some parameters are still bearer specific and therefore under the scope of 3GPP-T3 to be stored on the USIM.

We agree that the service parameters should be defined clearly enough so that there is no doubt regarding which committee is in charge of the definition and so that there is no work duplication between 3GPP and OMA. Therefore, this LS is also sent to 3GPP-SA1 and thus warned of the possible issue.

3GPP-T3 look forward to further fruitful cooperation.

5 Overview

Dear 3GPP T3 working group:

The OMA Device Management WG is working on resolving the interoperability issues when both 3GPP (Releases 5 and 6) and OMA Client Provisioning specifications are used to provision service parameters. For example, the MMS service parameters can be placed on the smartcard according to both the 3GPP and OMA Client Provisioning specifications, and received OTA according to OMA Client Provisioning specification. In order to ensure interoperability with different implementations and availability of services, User Agent Behaviour and/or priority rules are required to resolve this.

OMA DM is aware that new service parameters are being planned to be incorporated in 3GPP specifications.

In order to resolve this issue and to prepare for further issues, OMA DM working group requests information about 3GPP plans for including service parameters in their specifications. We recommend that 3GPP and OMA actively coordinate our work in this area to resolve existing conflicts and avoid future inconsistencies. We have suggested a joint meeting in the section 7 below.
