>place. The delay is getting some of the 3GPP partners to decide on

>have now sorted this out, and will put text in SG07 and 33.900.

>Identification (the UCI) and the potential security issues. This refers to

>ETSI EG201 795 from the Human Factors Group. I'm happy to pursue this as

>it could go into 33.900.
