Background:

Rob Lockhart's applicable standards background is in cellular, data synchronisation, wireless packet data, one- and two-way paging, wireless personal area networks, wireless disabilities issues, and wireless surveillance (CALEA) standards.

Rob's technical background spans a quarter of a century in wireless infrastructure, networks, and applications plus he has been involved in standards for over a decade in multiple arenas ranging from cellular to infrared. He has held board, chair, co-chair, or editor positions in such diverse groups as the Infrared Data Association, the WAP Forum, Bluetooth SIG, the Personal Communications Industry Association, and the American Mobile Telecommunications Association.

Rob joined Motorola in 1974 and has been working on 3GPP Terminal standardisation for the last two years and has attended all T2 meetings during that time as the Motorola T1 delegate.
