The 3GPP block rates will be available **until 18:00 Hrs., IST on 23rd Jan 2020**, or until they are all run out – whichever happens first. Cancellations:

In case you need an invitation letter from COAI for visa purpose, **please complete the details in the Visa Section of the Indian Friends of 3GPP main page**. It is necessary that you book the hotel first, and cite the hotel booking reference number in the invitation request. Letters will be processed within five working days of receiving your request. Do ensure that your requests reach us before 15 Feb 2020. Please do not contact **ETSI or the meeting chairman for visa letters.**

About Hyderabad:

Hyderabad is the capital of Telangana in Southern India, located on the banks of the Musi River and on the Deccan Plateau. Telugu (the state language of Telangana and one of India's six living classical languages) and Urdu are widely spoken in Hyderabad, and most educated people speak Telugu, Urdu, Hindi and/or English. English signs are common throughout the city. Hyderabad was historically known as a pearl and diamond trading center, and it continues to be known as the "City of Pearls".

Like many Indian cities Hyderabad has a tropical climate. The best time to visit the city is from mid-November to mid-February. Temperatures are mild with abundant sunshine during this time and average temperature range from a low of 15°C (59°F) to a high of 29°C (85°F). March to June is hot and dry with occasional thunderstorms. Highs can reach 45°C (113°F) or more and lack of air-conditioning can make it feel very uncomfortable. July, August, September and October can be quite warm and humid and low-pressure systems from the Bay of Bengal during the monsoon season can cause heavy rain for days.

Like many other fast-growing cities, Hyderabad also has its traffic woes. Its roads can get very crowded during the peak hours of the day. This may be kept in mind while planning any travel inside the city.
