All documents were approved with the exception of CR33.102-041 (S3-99520) which was withdrawn from the meeting because of concerns about the impact of permitting no encryption as an option in the signalling. The decision to withdraw this CR was endorsed by Mike Walker, and by Ericsson, who were the source of the CR. This issue has been flagged as an outstanding issue (SP-99xxx) concerning the security architecture specified in TS 33.102. The expected completion date has been recorded as March 2000 (SA#7).

It was reported that Lucent had objected to CR33.102-031 (S3-99542) in S3, nevertheless the CR was approved.

TR-45

It was well received by the SA plenary to hear that TR-45 has adopted the 3GPP AKA. Well done to all those that were involved in supporting the 3GPP proposal in TR-45 through technical contributions and lobbying. It was reported that further lobbying is required (especially in TR-45.2) during the 3 month review period prior to our joint meeting with AHAG in April.

MAP security

The proposal on how to progress MAP security in R99 was accepted. We will have a joint meeting with N2 early next year. The date was changed to 10-11 January 2000 (because 6-7 January conflicts with a N2 meeting on VHE/OSA). The scope of this meeting will be extended to Enhanced User Identity Confidentiality.

Note: TOR for that meeting will be drafted as a result of a SA side meeting (not finished at the moment)

LI architecture

There was a concern because 33.107 was not tabled before for information, but there were no good reasons to delay approval. 33.107 was approved under the condition, that it will be passed to S2 for review. The document is now under change control so that all changes are visible to SA plenary.

Conclusions

- All S3 documents are completed (with the exception of guide to 3G security).
- Only corrections are expected.
- All technical features are endorsed by SA.
